In terms of teaching children to learn to read:

 We use Read, Write Inc (RWI) phonics programme

 last summer 88% of our
 x1 children achieved the ph

Y1 children achieved the phonic check which is above the national average

- 2) Have skilled, trained adults listen to all children read regularly
- Use Reading Masters with children in Y1 to Y6 to give them a wide range of reading materials using these to develop key reading skills (inference, comprehension and deduction).
- Place all children onto Accelerate Reader once they have completed the RWI phonics programme.
- 5) Make use of online tutoring and Reading Unlocked if additional support is required.

In terms of teaching children to love to read:



- The class teacher reads aloud to the children everyday so that they can hear a story over time
- 2) Take the children to our wonderful school library at least once per fortnight
- 3) Take children to the local library at least half termly
- 4) Have books on display and around school that will interest and engage the children
- 5) Talk positively to the children about the joy of reading
- 6) Stories are used in assemblies to develop key themes again giving them exposure to stories being read aloud.

<u>Safeguarding</u> - If you have any concerns or worries about your child or any child in school, you can talk to our Safeguarding Team.

Our team is made up of three staff (Mr. Dore, Mrs. Perez and Mrs.

Green). They can be easily identified around school as they wear a yellow lanyard so they stand out from other staff.

<u>What is a DSL (Designated Safeguarding Lead)?</u> - A Designated Safeguarding Lead is the person who has responsibility for ensuring the Academy Trust and School's safeguarding policy is followed.

<u>What does a DSL do?</u> - The role of the Designated Safeguarding Lead and their deputies:

- Make sure all staff are aware how to raise safeguarding concerns
- Ensure all staff understand the signs of child abuse and neglect
- Make referrals to social care

• Monitor children who are the subject of child protection and child in need plans

Maintain accurate and secure child protection records

You will also be able to see us at the gates either in the morning or the afternoon or you can contact the school office and ask to speak with one of us.

#### Census Day -
