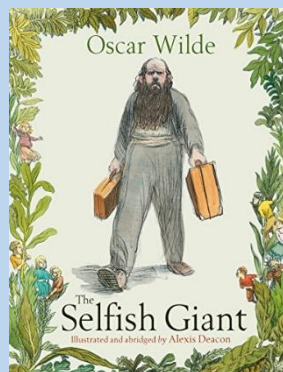


English

Our latest writing unit is based on the classic text 'The Selfish Giant' by Oscar Wilde. We will be developing our skills in order to produce our own versions of the story. We will be learning about: subordination, active and passive voice, determiners, clauses and phrases and morphology in Grammar Masters sessions.

Reading Masters will continue to drive our reading lessons and we will cover a range of texts in these sessions (one per week studied in depth).

As before, we will be working on keeping our handwriting neat, joined and consistent. We will continue to practise our handwriting in school, and for our homework.



Spanish

Our next Spanish unit is all about ordering food in a cafe. We will learn the different names for items of food and drink, and how to play the role of customer and server (with associated language in full sentences).

Maths

Our maths topics for this term will be – Statistics, Shape and Geometry. We will be learning to handle and create a range of graphs and charts, classify and describe the properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes and to plot and describe shapes on all four quadrants of a grid.

The year 6s will be revising like crazy as SATS are just a few weeks away – any additional support you can give your Year 6 child at home will make a positive impact – especially if there are gaps in their times tables facts.

Art

We will be looking at landscape art this half-term. Each of the lessons will explore a different aspect of landscape art: from linear and atmospheric perspective to ways to use watercolours to create effects, or tearing paper to create collages. Each session is designed to help build up the children's understanding of mediums and techniques so that by the end of they will have everything they need to create their own amazing landscape art using whichever techniques and mediums they think best suited to the purpose.



Computing

Our topic for computing will be 'Computer systems and Networks – Bletchley Park'. The children will be using simple cyphers and codes to create and decode messages and will then learn about computer encryption and the importance of keeping themselves and their data and information secure online.

Homework

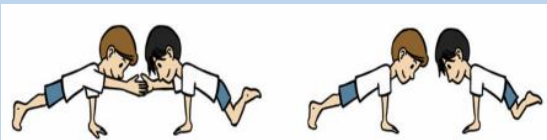
Homework will continue to be set on a Friday and collected (checked online for Year 6) the following Wednesday.

Children are encouraged to use Times Table Rock Stars and read at home as much as possible- at least three times a week is recommended.

Please ensure that children come into school wearing their PE kit on Tuesdays and Thursdays. In gymnastics, we will be building on our last unit. We will be developing our partner balances and engaging core muscles for strength and stability. We will start with work on the floor, and progress to sequences on the apparatus.

Year 6 SATs

The Year 6 SATs will take place on the week beginning 13th May. The schedule will be as follows:

Monday- English paper 1: SPAG test (grammar and punctuation) – 45 minutes

English paper 2: SPAG test (spelling) – 15-20 minutes

Tuesday- English paper 3: Reading test – 60 minutes

Wednesday- Maths paper 1: arithmetic – 30 minutes

Maths paper 2: reasoning – 40 minutes

Thursday- Maths paper 3: reasoning – 40 minutes

The results are typically released at the end of the summer term, which falls in July.

On the days when SATs tests are taking place, the children will be invited into school for a free breakfast. We have found that this sets them up well for the day and gives them a proper chance to settle in before the tests start. We highly encourage all Year 6 pupils to attend. During SATs week, we will try to make the children as relaxed as possible. All we ask is that they try their best- no more pressure is needed than that.
