Anti-Bullying -

Our school anti-bullying definition is 'STOP' (Several Times On Purpose) and all of our children are aware of the definition of bullying:



Bullying is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can happen face to face or online.

We encourage every child to feel confident to share any concerns they may have about bullying and ensure that it is addressed sensitively and in accordance with our anti-bullying policy.

Children can share their concerns with any member of staff or via the worry box which can be found on the main corridor.

Anti-Bullying Week 2023: Make a Noise about Bullying – This year the theme is 'Make a Noise about Bullying'. We will start the week with Odd Sock day on Monday 13th November, where adults and children wear odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique. We are encouraging everyone to take part and look forward to seeing lots of odd socks in school.

The children will have a range of duties across the year contributing towards making our school a great place to be.

Family Support Worker (Connect 2 Project) – We are part of the Connect 2 project meaning that we will be eligible to have a paid for Family Support Worker for ½ day a fortnight. Claire will be holding a coffee morning on Monday 13th November (8.45am – 11.30am) – please do come along to meet her and find out what support she is able to offer.

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) – We have arranged a one off session whereby a worker from the DWP will come into school to be available for parents to meet with. The purpose of the meeting would be to enable parents to come and find out if there are any additional benefits you may be able to receive. This will be on Thursday 23rd November (9.15am until 1015am). Please do come along and see if you could receive more.



<u>Uniform Grant – We may</u> be able to offer assistance with basic school clothing needs for your child(ren).

You could be eligible if you receive:

- Income support
- Income based Jobseekers Allowance
- An income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under part VI of Immigation and Asylum Act 1999
- Where your annual income does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenues and Customs)

Working Tax credit 'run-on' - the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifyting for Working Tax credit

Please not if you are not entitled to Working Tax credit you are NOT eleigible for a clothing grant.

What will I receive:

Once a year you may claim for:-

- A pack of 2 shirts
- A jumper or cardigan
- A skirt or pair of trousers
- Sensible school shoes.

What do I need to do if I think I qualify?: Speak to the office staff and collect an application form.
