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**Topic Rationale:** This project teaches children about the physical and human features of coastal regions in our area and across the United Kingdom, including a detailed exploration of the coastal town of Whitby, in Yorkshire.

**Hook:** Option 1- Coastal visit. Before our visit, highlight which sea or ocean surrounds the coastal location. Explain that we will be exploring the human and physical features of the area. On location, children safely explore the area and record and classify their observations. Use cameras, tablets and drawing materials to collect data. Make picture maps using this information.

Option 2- Watch the 'features of the coastline' video. After watching, ask the children, 'Have you ever been to the coast in the UK? Where did you go? What did you see?' Discuss whether they have seen any of the features mentioned in the video and encourage them to describe them. Highlight coastal locations visited on a map. Children to sort picture cards into physical and human features.

**Final Outcome:** Design a coastal town that tourists would want to visit, Real-life problem stories, Soapbox Theatre production, Moth to a Flame exhibition.

**Parental involvement:** Home Learning tasks on Class Dojo e.g. Take a coastal walk spotting human and physical features, watch videos on the physical process of erosion, write a list of things that children and adults do to stay safe at the coast, choose a coastal location and draw a simple map etc. Phonics interventions- Use of the Oxford Owl virtual library and RWI videos.
