<u>RWInc Phonics -</u> Learning to read is one of the most important things your child will learn at our school. As so many things depend on us being able to read, we put as much energy as we possibly can into making sure that every single child learns to read as

quickly as possible.

Here at Marlborough, we teach phonics using the Read Write Inc. synthetic phonics scheme. This means words are broken down into the smallest units of sound. We start by teaching the children how to 'read' the sounds in words and how those sounds can be written down. This is essential for reading, but it also helps children learn to spell well. We teach the children simple ways of remembering these sounds and letters.

The children also practise reading (and spelling) what we call 'tricky words', such as 'once,' 'have,' 'said' and 'where'. The children practise their reading with books that match the phonics and the 'tricky words' they know. Children then have the belief that they can read and this does wonders for their confidence.

Children in FS2, Y1 and Y2 have a phonic session everyday in school. We split the children into groups which are based on the phonic assessment (these are carried out every half term) so that they are working at the right level. During the session, the children practice, sounds, read their phonic books and practice writing the sounds that they are familiar with. In order to help us support your child, please do read with them daily and share the books they are bringing home.

Pupil Premium Funding - Pupil Premium is funding we receive from the government to improve education outcomes for disadvantaged pupils in school. Evidence shows that disadvantaged children may face additional challenges in reaching their potential and often do not perform as well as other pupils. We believe every child irrespective of their starting points, family circumstances or barriers to learning, should leave school excited about learning, resilient to setbacks and determined to succeed. There is a three-Stage approach to meeting the needs of disadvantaged children at Marlborough. We integrate what we do to create whole school 'Pupil Premium Friendly' practice.

These stages are;

- 1) creating a language rich learning environment,
- 2) building excellent learning practice in each classroom and
- 3) linking interventions with class teaching to close the attainment gap.

We have children working across the school in small groups and one to one with teachers and teaching assistants on different intervention programs to support their reading, writing and maths. <u>Anti-Bullying Week –</u> It was great to see so many of the children and staff wearing their odd socks last Monday. This was all part of our work on raising awareness of how we will all be saying 'STOP' to bullying.

We have been working to establish a whole school agreement of what bullying is so that we have a shared understanding. Our school definition of bullying is:

Bullying includes a range of abusive behaviour that is repeated and intended to hurt someone either physically or emotionally.

In order to ensure children can remember the definition quickly we use:

S – Several

T – Times

O – On P - Purpose



We have been strongly encouraging everyone to 'Reach Out' if you are being bullied or are aware of someone who is. The children understand that you can Reach Out to family members, all adults in school and other children in school.

We will be continuing to reinforce these messages with the children throughout the year.

Y5 Trip to Aquarium -

As part of the Widening Horizons project children from Y5 visited the Aquarium. They were given access to the VIP areas, met all of the staff, found out all about the various jobs that the staff



do, met Friday the turtle and had talks about the star fish and the rock pool area. After lunch they took part in a workshop examining artefacts of various sea creatures, e.g. whale skin, mermaids purses sword fish nose and coral. A fabulous time was had by all with everyone looking forward to the next visit.
