**<u>RWInc Phonics</u>** - Learning to read is one of the most important things your child will learn at our school. As so many things depend on us being able to read, we put as much energy as we possibly can into

making sure that every single child learns to read as quickly as possible.

Here at Marlborough, we teach phonics using the Read Write Inc. synthetic phonics scheme. This means words are broken down into the smallest units of sound. We start by teaching the children how to 'read' the sounds in words and how those sounds can be written down. This is essential for reading, but it also helps children learn to spell well. We teach the children simple ways of remembering these sounds and letters.

The children also practise reading (and spelling) what we call 'tricky words', such as 'once,' 'have,' 'said' and 'where'. The children practise their reading with books that match the phonics and the 'tricky words' they know. Children then have the belief that they can read and this does wonders for their confidence.

Children in FS2, Y1 and Y2 have a phonic session everyday in school. We split the children into groups which are based on the phonic assessment (these are carried out every half term) so that they are working at the right level. During the session, the children practice, sounds, read their phonic books and practice writing the sounds that they are familiar with.

In order to help us support your child, please do read with them daily and share the books they are bringing home.

**Pupil Premium Funding** - Pupil Premium is funding we receive from the government to improve education outcomes for disadvantaged pupils in school. Evidence shows that disadvantaged children may face additional challenges in reaching their potential and often do not perform as well as other pupils. We believe every child irrespective of their starting points, family circumstances or barriers to learning, should leave school excited about learning, resilient to set-backs and determined to succeed. There is a three-Stage approach to meeting the needs of disadvantaged children at Marlborough. We integrate what we do to create whole school 'Pupil Premium Friendly' practice.

These stages are;

- 1) creating a language rich learning environment,
- 2) building excellent learning practice in each

classroom and

3) linking interventions with class teaching to close the attainment gap.

We have children working across the school in small groups and one to one with teachers and teaching assistants on different intervention programs to support their reading, writing and maths.
