<u>Headteacher</u> <u>Tea</u> <u>Party</u> <u>—</u> As part of our rewards system we want to acknowledge those children who always try their hardest, take part in all the

opportunities offered and always follow our Treat (Trust, respect, equality, ambition and togetherness) values. Each half term one child per class is selected to join Mrs. Green for cake, crisps and squash.

<u>School Library –</u> We are well under way with the works to improve our library. Having done a thorough stock check and tidied the room it is now evident where we need new books. As part of Reach South we have been able to request additional monies to help us with this meaning the children will soon has access to



a far wider range of books. We will also be introducing a new library management system so that we can keep track of all the library stock.

Having a well stocked and well arranged library is very important as it helps to reinforce our love of reading with the children.



Teaching of Reading – As you know the children begin their reading journey at Marlborough through being taught Read,Write Inc phonics. This is a systematic and structured approach to the teaching of early reading. We know it works well as we have seen a rising

trend in children achieving the phonic check at the end of Y1.

It is important that once children have successfully moved through Read Write Inc that they continue to develop their reading skills and broaden and deepen the range of books they read and the books they have read to them.

Once children have successfully achieved the Read Write Inc programme they will be moving onto Accelerate Reader.

<u>Accelerate Reader - Is a computer programme that helps</u>



teachers manage and monitor children's independent reading practice. Your child will select a book from the slection available on the main upstairs corridor at their own level. Your child then reads the actual book and when finished, your child will take a short quiz on the computer.

Passing the quiz is an indication that your child understood what was read. Accelerated Reader gives children and teachers feedback based on the quiz results, which the teacher then uses to help your child set goals and direct ongoing reading practice. If your child is in either Scyamore or Beech class please do look out for your child's accelerated reader book coming home after Christmas.

<u>Christmas Fayre</u> It was wonderful to see so many people at our Chrismas Fayre. We raised £435.24 with the monies going towards some new books for the library. A huge thank you to the Parent Group for organising such an amazing event as it enabled us all to come together.

Attendance - Our current attendance is 84%. We are <u>below</u> the national expectation of 96%. It is really important that your child(ren) are in school, on time, every day.

The class with the best attendance for the last two weeks is Maple Class. Well done!

At the moment we are tracking those children with 100% attendance – this is something to be very proud of. They will be receiving one of our very special 100% attendance certificates in January.

As a school we aim for 96% attendance which would bring us in line with the national average. With your help, we are hoping to get as close to this figure as possible!

We have 35 children who have managed 96% attendance or better over the last half term.

<u>Want to speak to an adult in school</u> — There are lots of ways that you can ask to speak to someone in school, including:

- Contact your child's teacher or the school office through Dojo
- Speak to the member of staff on the gate in the mornings or afternoons
- Phone the office and ask for someone to phone you back.

If you want to speak to Mrs. Green please be aware that she is not in school everyday as she works with other Reach South schools within Plymouth for 2 ½ days per week. If Mrs. Green is not available then Mr. Dore (Deputy Headteacher) will be only too happy to speak with you.
