


## 19/1/21 Famous Buildings


How many of these famous buildings can you identify - do a 'famous building' google image search to help. Once you have named as many as you can - choose one and complete this fact-file.

## Gargoyle Facts

- A gargoyle is a sculpture or rain spout carved to look like a strange or monstrous creature. A gargoyle can also be called a grotesquery. The gargoyles which direct the water from the roof usually have wide mouths for the water to pass through.
- These odd looking sculptures can be mythical or real creatures, and some are made to look like humans.
- Gargoyles were also seen as 'guardians' of the building, to ward off evil.
- Gargoyles are intimidating sculptures and perfect for the likes of Lords who built fortresses and castles.
- Gothic cathedrals are known for their gargoyles, but gargoyles can also be found on modern buildings too.
