

Every week the following homework will be set:

- Maths YR Y6. Set on a Friday and returned on the Wednesday.
- Project/Handwriting YR Y6. Set on a Friday and retuned on the Wednesday.
- Phonics Check Dojo for the sound they are learning.
- Reading YR Y6 10 mins per day
- Spellings Y1 Y6 set on a Monday and tested the following Monday. These will be posted on Dojo.

Safeguarding: Safeguarding In School - If you have any concerns or worries about your child or any child in school, you can talk to our Safeguarding Team.



Our team is made up of five staff (Mrs. Green, Mr. Dore, Mrs. Hackworthy, Mrs. Perez and Mrs. Skinner). They can be easily identified around school as they wear a yellow lanyard so they stand out from other staff.

What is a DSL (Designated Safeguarding Lead)? - A Designated Safeguarding Lead is the person who has responsibility for ensuring the Academy Trust and School's safeguarding policy is followed.

What does a DSL do? - The role of the Designated Safeguarding Lead and their deputies:

- Make sure all staff are aware how to raise safeguarding concerns
- Ensure all staff understand the signs of child abuse and neglect
- · Make referrals to social care
- Monitor children who are the subject of child protection and child in need plans
- Maintain accurate and secure child protection records
