<u>What a half term –</u> It is hard to imagine that we are now half way through the autumn term and Christmas is rapidly approaching! We have achieved a great deal together, including:

- Establishing a set of ethos values known as the TREAT values.
- Establishing a consistent approach to homework across the school.
- Implemented Reading Masters from Y1 to Y6.

Thank you to everyone who came to the recent parents' evening as this is a really important way of finding out how your child is doing in school.

<u>Attendance</u> - Our current attendance is <u>95%</u>. We are <u>below</u> the national expectation of 96%. It is really important that your child(ren) are in school, on time, every day.

'Every child, in school, everyday'

We believe that good attendance at school is really important, not least because research shows that absence from school impacts negatively on children's progress and achievement and their social and emotional well-being.

We will be focussing on our Persistent Absence figure which is high. Persistent Absence means that a child's attendance has fallen below 90%. As a school we have a series of actions we take when attendance falls below 90%. The information given to parents is driven by the process set by the DfE, which we as a school, must follow and is therefore official in nature. As a school we always want to work together in partnership with our families to secure the best possible outcomes for all our children. If you are experiencing difficulties with or have questions about attendance, please do contact school.

The class with the best attendance for the last two weeks is Sycamore Class. Well done!

consistent approach to homework. Homework comes out every Friday and is to be returned to school the following Wednesday. Please do encourage your child to complete the work and return it in their plastic wallet.
